## **Foreword**

This report is a summary of cross-cutting audit findings in the audit reports of Donor Funded Projects for the year ended 30 June, 2024.

The Auditor-General is mandated by the Constitution of Kenya under Article 229, to audit and report on the use of public resources by all entities funded from public funds. These entities include the National Government, County Governments, the Judiciary, Parliament, Statutory Bodies/State Corporations, Commissions, Independent Offices, Public Debt, Political Parties funded from public funds, other government agencies and any other entity funded from public funds. In addition, Article 229(6) requires the Auditor-General to confirm whether or not public resources have been applied lawfully and in an effective way. The mandate of the Auditor-General is further expounded by the Public Audit Act, 2015.

Article 229(7) of the Constitution requires the Auditor-General to audit and submit reports to Parliament or the relevant County Assembly within six (6) months after the end of the financial year. However, Section 81(4) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, reduces the timelines for audit and reporting to three (3) months by giving entities leeway up to the end of September to prepare and submit financial statements for audit. This reduces the duration for audit and reporting from six (6) months as mandated by the Constitution to three (3) months. This has been adversely affecting the audit scope and quality in reporting, which affects the efficiency and effectiveness of oversight by Parliament and the County Assemblies.

Further, the mechanism for follow up on implementation of audit recommendations is ineffective and as such most audit queries recur in subsequent years due to lack of decisive action. Section 204(1)(g) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 provides that the Cabinet Secretary for matters relating to finance may apply sanctions to a national government entity that fails to address issues raised by the Auditor-General, to the satisfaction of the Auditor-General.

However, despite numerous reports indicating lack of accountability and documents to support the legality and effectiveness in the use of public resources, failure to apply the requisite sanctions and consequences has resulted to some Accounting Officers not adequately accounting for the management and use of public resources with impunity. Lack of action and sanctions has also led to fiscal indiscipline including misallocations, wastage of resources, lack of value for money in implementation of projects and loss of public funds, thereby impacting negatively on development programmes. This in turn threatens economic growth and sustainability of quality service delivery to citizens. There are instances where some Accounting Officers are in breach of Section 62 of the Public Audit Act, 2015 by failing to adequately prepare for audit which is exhibited by inaccuracies in financial statements presented for audit, lack of requisite supporting documents, several revisions of financial statements and, in some cases, lack of cooperation with the auditors during the audit process.

The Office of the Auditor-General has been continuously improving on the effectiveness and quality of the audit process to ensure that the results of the audit and the recommendations thereof are credible, relevant, reliable and value-adding. This is geared towards influencing improved decision making and positive impact on the lives and livelihoods of citizens and other stakeholders. Provision of quality and effective audit services and confirmation of the lawfulness and effectiveness in use of public resources requires comprehensive scrutiny and evaluation of supporting documents. Most critical is the physical confirmation of the existence and utilization of projects or programmes implemented throughout the country. To achieve this requires an independent and well-resourced audit Office with guaranteed adequate funding to enable efficient, effective and timely execution of oversight as well as retention of optimal staffing levels to ensure continuous, quality and sustainable audit operations.

The Office continues to seek financial independence and support from Parliament and the Executive through The National Treasury for enhancement of resources to enable us build technical capacity, expand our presence in the counties, widen the scope and comprehensiveness of audit and motivate staff. We continue to devolve our services closer to the people through establishment of Regional Offices and construction of office premises to accommodate our staff in order to address the audit needs at the devolved level. We have established fifteen (15) Regional Offices and constructed office premises in Garissa, Kakamega, Eldoret and Embu. Plans for construction of a Regional Office in Mombasa and our Headquarters in Nairobi, are currently at the design stage and have been delayed by lack of adequate funding. However, the Office will continue to appeal to Parliament and The National Treasury for adequate funds to enable us to perform our functions and achieve our mandate in enhancing accountability across government, both at the national and county levels, and in all other entities funded from public funds.

The audit scope has been expanding over the years due to the expansion of Government programs to ensure sustainable development and delivery of continuous and quality services to the citizens. This has led to growth in the national budget and establishment of additional entities that I am required to audit and report on. In addition to Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs), State Owned Enterprises and County Governments entities, all the over nine thousand (9,000) Public Secondary Schools were from 30 June, 2021 required to prepare and submit financial statements to the Auditor-General for audit and quite a number have complied. I am also required to audit and report on financial statements for all the three hundred and seventy-six (376) Level 4 hospitals and eighteen (18) Level 5 hospitals separately. Further, in the current financial year, I am required to audit a total of thirty-five (35) Teachers' Training Colleges, two hundred and thirty (230) Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) Institutions funded by the Exchequer and Community Vocational Training Institutions estimated to be over one thousand and two hundred (1,200). In addition, implementation of new projects and establishment of new funds requires timely oversight.

During the period under review, the Office made great strides in enhancing delivery of audit services to the people of Kenya. The Office has entered into partnerships with other Supreme Audit Institutions (SAIs) regionally and globally and with local oversight institutions such as the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), the State Corporations Advisory Committee (SCAC), the Salaries and Remuneration Commission (SRC), the Commission on Revenue Allocation (CRA) among other organizations, as we strive to increase the impact of audit through learning, knowledge sharing, innovation, and collaboration.

Specific reports together with my opinion for each of the entity are contained in the respective Donor Funded Project's audited financial statements for the year ended 30 June, 2024, which I have already submitted to Parliament, and the respective Accounting Officer.

I thank the entire staff of the Office of the Auditor-General for their commitment, passion and professionalism in carrying out their duties despite the challenges posed by lack of adequate funds and tight timelines. Special appreciation goes to the Team that compiled this Summary Report.

I also appreciate my clients or auditees for the cooperation they accorded to my staff during the audit.

## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 Constitutional Mandate of the Auditor-General

The Office of the Auditor-General (OAG) is an Independent Office established by Article 229 of the Constitution of Kenya. The Office is charged with the primary oversight role of ensuring accountability in the use of public resources within the three arms of Government (the Legislature, the Judiciary and the Executive) as well as the Constitutional Commissions and Independent Offices. The mandate of the Auditor-General is further expounded by the Public Audit Act, 2015.

The Constitution requires the Auditor-General to audit and submit the audit reports of the public entities to Parliament and the relevant County Assemblies by 31 December, every year. In carrying out the mandate, the Auditor-General, is also required, under Article 229(6) to assess and confirm whether the public entities have utilised the public resources entrusted to them lawfully and in an effective way.

Further, the objects and authority of the Auditor-General, as outlined in Article 249 of the Constitution, are: to protect the sovereignty of the people; to secure the observance by all State Organs of democratic values and principles; and, to promote constitutionalism. The Auditor-General has also been given powers by the Constitution, under Article 252, to conduct investigations, conciliations, mediations and negotiations and to issue summons to witnesses for investigations.

# 1.2 Responsibilities of Management and those Charged with Governance

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the International Public Sector Accounting Standards (IPSAS), as prescribed by the Public Sector Accounting Standards Board (PSASB), and for the submission of the financial statements to the Auditor-General in accordance with the provisions of Section 47 of the Public Audit Act, 2015.

Management is also responsible for maintaining an effective internal control environment necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and for the assessment of the effectiveness of internal control, risk management and governance.

Further, Management is required to ensure that the activities, financial transactions and information reflected in the financial statements, are in compliance with the law and other relevant or applicable authorities and that public resources are applied in an effective way.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process, reviewing the effectiveness of how each Management monitors compliance with relevant legislative and regulatory requirements, ensuring that effective processes and systems are in place to address key roles and responsibilities in relation to governance and risk management, and ensuring the adequacy and effectiveness of the control environment.

## 1.3 Auditor-General's Responsibility

My responsibility is to conduct an audit of the financial statements in accordance with the International Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAIs), and to issue an auditor's report. The audit report includes my opinion as provided by Section 48 of the Public Audit Act, 2015, and the report is submitted to Parliament in compliance with Article 229(7) of the Constitution.

In addition, Article 229(6) of the Constitution requires me to express a conclusion on whether or not, in all material respects, the activities, financial transactions and information reflected in the financial statements are in compliance with the law and other authorities that govern them, and that public resources are applied in an effective way. I also consider the entities' control environment in order to give an assurance on the effectiveness of internal controls, risk management and governance processes and systems, in accordance with the provisions of Section 7(1)(a) of the Public Audit Act, 2015.

Further, I am required to submit the audit report in accordance with Article 229(7) of the Constitution.

This description forms part of my auditor's report.

I am independent in accordance with Article 249(2) of the Constitution of Kenya and ISSAI 130 on the Code of Ethics. I have fulfilled other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the ISSAI and in accordance with other ethical requirements applicable to performing audits of public entities in the Republic of Kenya.

## 1.4 Reporting Structure

The reporting structure of my report addresses the reporting requirements of Article 229(6) of the Constitution of Kenya, which requires that an audit report shall confirm whether or not public resources have been applied lawfully and in an effective way. Section 7(1)(a) of the Public Audit Act, 2015 also requires that I provide assurance on the effectiveness of internal controls, risk management and overall governance.

Further, I am expected to read the other information provided by Management and report whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements.

In order to address these requirements, my audit reports contain the following:

- i. **Report on the Financial Statements**, in which I give an audit opinion on whether the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects the financial position and performance of the entity.
- ii. Report on Lawfulness and Effectiveness in Use of Public Resources, in which I give a conclusion on whether or not public resources have been applied lawfully and in an effective way.

- iii. Report on Effectiveness of Internal Controls, Risk Management and Governance, in which I give a conclusion on whether internal controls, risk management and overall governance were effective.
- iv. Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements is included where applicable, especially for the entities that are registered under the Companies Act, 2015, any other enabling legislation or authorities and donor conditionalities that require such disclosure.

## 1.5 Audit Opinions

I have expressed different types of audit opinions based on the following criteria:

## a) Unmodified Opinion

The books of accounts and underlying records agree with the financial statements and no material misstatements were found. The financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the operations of the entity. Donor funded projects' financial statements with unmodified opinions are one hundred and sixty-nine (169) as listed in **Appendix 1.** 

#### b) Qualified Opinion

Financial transactions were recorded and are to a large extent in agreement with the underlying records, except for cases where I noted material misstatements or omissions in the financial statements. The issues though material, are not widespread or persistent. Donor funded projects' financial statements with qualified opinion are forty-three (43) as listed in **Appendix 2**.

## c) Adverse Opinion

The financial statements exhibit significant misstatements with the underlying accounting records. There exists significant disagreement(s) between the financial statements and the underlying books of accounts and/or standards. These discrepancies and misstatements are widespread, persistent and require considerable interventions by Management to rectify. ADB Africa Climate Summit Project under The National Treasury had an adverse opinion.

#### d) Disclaimer of Opinion

The financial statements exhibit serious and significant misstatements that may arise from inadequate information, limitation of scope, inadequacy or lack of proper records such that I was not able to form an opinion on the financial operations.

#### 2.0 KEY AUDIT FINDINGS

The sections below highlight key audit findings made during the audit of donor funded projects for the year ended 30 June, 2024.

## 2.1 Overall Budgetary Control and Performance

The cumulative estimated receipts and expenditure for the donor funded projects in financial year 2023/2024 amounted to Kshs.241,882,696,627 Kshs.237,783,235,826 respectively. The actual receipts and expenditure were Kshs.206,867,143,866 and Kshs.197,239,340,115, resulting in underfunding of Kshs.35,015,552,761 and an under-expenditure Kshs.40,543,895,711. Further, there was a budget imbalance between the budgeted receipts and expenditures for the period amounting to Kshs.4,099,460,801 and an under absorption of funds totalling Kshs.9,627,803,751 or 5% of the actual receipts as detailed in **Table 1** below:

In addition, analysis of receipts revealed that twenty-seven (27) donor funded projects realized an overfunding totalling Kshs.7,916,515,215 while one hundred and forty-three (143) donor funded projects had an underfunding amounting to Kshs.42,932,067,975. Further analysis indicated that thirty-one (31) donor funded projects recorded an over-expenditure amounting to Kshs.7,159,146,226, while one hundred and forty-five (145) projects had an under-expenditure totalling Kshs.47,703,041,936, respectively. These are detailed in **Appendix 3**.

#### 2.1.1 Receipts Trend Analysis

During the financial year 2023/2024, the total budgeted receipts amounted to Kshs.241,882,696,627, which was an increase of Kshs.27,496,913,748 from the previous financial year's budget allocation of Kshs.214,385,782,879. **Table 2** below shows the trend in budgeted receipts against the actual receipts for the last three (3) financial years.




Figure 1: Receipts Trend Analysis for the Last Three (3) Years

The underfunding was caused by delayed disbursement of funds.

## 2.1.2 Expenditure Trend Analysis

During the year under review, the total budgeted expenditure amounted to Kshs.237,783,235,826 which was an increase from the previous financial year's budgeted expenditure of Kshs.218,131,154,472. **Table 3** below shows the trend in budgeted expenditure against the actual expenditure for the last three (3) financial years.




Figure 2: Expenditure Trend Analysis for the Last Three (3) Years

The shortfall in expenditure was mainly attributed to delays in fund disbursement, slow procurement processes, and implementation challenges across various projects.

## 2.1.3 Actual Receipts Versus Actual Expenditure Trend Analysis

The total expenditure for the donor funded projects in the financial year 2023/2024 amounted to Kshs.197,239,340,115 representing an absorption rate of 95.8% of the total actual receipts of Kshs.206,867,143,866. This was a decline from the previous year, whose reported expenditure amounted to Kshs.164,149,431,478 against total annual receipts of Kshs.164,820,020,780 translating to an absorption rate of 99.5%. **Table 4** below depicts actual receipts versus actual expenditure over the last three (3) years.




Figure 3: Absorption Trend Analysis for the Last Three (3) Years

## 2.2 Pending Bills

Review of the two hundred and thirteen (213) donor funded projects revealed that one hundred and fifteen (115) donor funded projects as detailed in **Appendix 4** had pending bills amounting to Kshs.68,877,678,185 which were not settled during the year.

Analysis of Mombasa Port Area Road Development Project and Kenya Transport Sector Support Project, both implemented by Kenya National Highways Authority (KENHA) had the highest pending bills of Kshs.7,734,645,628 and Kshs.7,148,109,740, respectively.

These obligations primarily relate to delayed payments for civil works, procurement of goods and services, consultancy contracts, and staff-related dues. Notably, in some instances, the bills have remained unsettled for prolonged periods, undermining project timelines and delivery.

Further, the audit revealed that some pending bills lacked key documentation such as registers, detailed schedules and ageing analyses. Failure to clear pending bills as a first charge of the subsequent year's budget as required by The National Treasury Circulars and Section 74(4)(d) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, could lead to sanctions against the responsible officer.

## 2.2.1 Pending Bills Trend Analysis

Donor funded projects have continued to accumulate pending bills with a steady increase noted over the last four (4) years as tabulated in **Table 5** below:




Figure 4: Pending Bills Trend Analysis for Donor Funded Projects

## 3.0 SUMMARY OF AUDIT OPINIONS

## 3.1 Analysis of Audit Opinions

A total of two hundred and thirteen (213) financial statements for donor-funded projects for the year ended 30 June, 2024 were audited, upon which I expressed my audit opinions as detailed in **Appendices 1** and **2** and summarized in **Table 6** and illustrated in **Figure 5** below:

Out of the two hundred and thirteen (213) donor funded projects audited for the year ended 30 June, 2024, a total of one hundred and sixty-nine (169) donor funded projects had an unmodified audit opinion, forty-three (43) donor funded projects had a qualified opinion, while one (1) donor funded project had an adverse opinion. None of the donor funded projects had a disclaimer of opinion.

These results indicate that while a majority of the donor funded projects' financial statements were fairly presented, a significant number still exhibited weaknesses in financial reporting.

## 3.2 Audit Opinions Trend Analysis




Figure 6: Audit Opinion Analysis for the Last Four (4) Years

There has been a gradual and consistent improvement in the opinions for the donor funded projects' financial statements over the last four (4) years as illustrated in **Table 7** and **Figure 6** below, with a rise in unmodified opinions and a reduction in qualified opinions.

During the financial year 2023/2024, an analysis of audit opinions for donor funded projects revealed notable improvements in financial reporting. The number of donor funded projects with an unmodified audit opinion increased from one hundred and fifty-three (153) in the previous year to one hundred and sixty-nine (169), reflecting enhanced compliance with reporting requirements and improved financial transparency. At the same time, qualified audit opinions decreased from sixty-six (66) to forty-three (43), while adverse opinions remained at one (1), and no disclaimer opinion issued for the second consecutive year.

## 4.0 SUMMARY OF MATERIAL OBSERVATIONS

## 4.1 Summary of Systemic Issues




Figure 7: Summary of Systemic Issues Affecting Donor Funded Projects

The audit of donor funded projects for the financial year 2023/2024 identified common systemic weaknesses across implementing entities. These included financial reporting gaps, delayed or stalled projects, low absorption of funds, procurement irregularities and non-compliance with contract conditions. Further, governance and oversight challenges such as ineffective internal audits and weak risk management frameworks were also noted. These systemic issues have been summarized in the thematic area presented in **Figure 7** below.

Based on the audit findings for donor-funded projects in the 2023/2024 financial year, Accounting Officers are urged to address the root causes of recurring systemic weaknesses. Key interventions should include enhancing capacity, developing and implementing standard operating procedures, strengthening internal controls and reinforcing risk management processes. Governance lapses, financial reporting irregularities, and procurement non-compliance must be prioritized to ensure transparency, accountability, and effective use of donor resources. The issues observed point to broader weaknesses in project management and oversight, which require immediate corrective actions. The following sections highlight critical observations noted during the audit.

## 4.2 Financial Reporting Issues




Figure 8: Issues Related to the Presentation of Financial Statements in Donor Funded Projects

Over the past four (4) years, there has been a gradual improvement in the presentation of financial statements and maintenance of accounting records under donor funded projects implemented by public entities. This progress is evidenced by

the increased number of donor funded projects with unmodified audit opinions and a decline in instances of material misstatements. However, several donor funded projects continue to exhibit deficiencies in financial reporting. A summary of the key issues related to financial reporting, and the number of affected donor funded projects, is illustrated in **Figure 8** below.

#### 4.2.1 Presentation and Disclosure of Financial Statements

Review of the two hundred and thirteen (213) financial statements submitted for audit revealed that seven (7) donor-funded projects as summarized in **Table 8** did not comply with the prescribed Public Sector Accounting Standards Board (PSASB) reporting formats. These deficiencies compromise the reliability, transparency, and accountability of the financial statements.

#### Notable issues identified include:

- i. Failure to provide detailed reports linking project outcomes to absorbed budget allocations, thereby limiting performance evaluation.
- ii. Omission of key financial disclosures and presentation errors, raising concerns over the accuracy and completeness of the financial statements.
- iii. Non-disclosure of prior year adjustments in the statement of financial assets and liabilities, affecting transparency and comparative analysis.
- iv. Incomplete financial statements and notes thereto, lacking critical information such as statement of comparison of budget and actual amounts and explanations for significant variances between budgeted and actual amounts.
- v. Inclusion of transactions outside the reporting period without proper disclosure or justification, contrary to the cash basis under IPSAS.

#### 4.2.2 Inaccuracies in the Financial Statements

During the year under review, financial statements for twelve (12) donor funded projects contained material inaccuracies amounting to Kshs.472,673,265 as detailed in **Appendix 5**. The issues identified included unreconciled variances between financial statements line items and supporting schedules, unsupported prior year adjustments, inclusion of unrelated cash balances, and misclassification of expenditures. These inaccuracies undermine the reliability of financial reporting and raise concerns over the adequacy of internal controls and financial management practices across the affected donor funded projects.

#### 4.2.3 Unreconciled Variances

Review of the financial statements for donor funded projects revealed that fourteen (14) projects, as detailed in **Appendix 6**, had unreconciled variances and unreconciled balances amounting to Kshs.2,460,732,337. These discrepancies stemmed from inconsistencies between general ledger and financial statement amounts, misstatements in donor and Government of Kenya (GoK) counterpart funding, variances in bank reconciliations, unsupported adjustments to accounts payable, discrepancies in expenditure reporting, and unsubstantiated balances in project-specific disbursement records. These unresolved variances raise concerns over the effectiveness of internal controls and the reliability of the financial statements presented.

### 4.2.4 Unsupported Expenditure

During the year under review, the audit revealed that twenty-two (22) donor funded projects, as detailed in **Appendix 7**, incurred expenditures amounting to Kshs.2,548,270,736 without adequate supporting documentation. These expenditures included payments made without sufficient evidence such as approved

work plans, payment vouchers, contracts, invoices, beneficiary attendance lists, or delivery confirmations. Failure to provide such documentation is contrary to Regulation 104(1) of the Public Finance Management (National Government) Regulations, 2015, which requires Accounting Officers to ensure proper use of public resources and maintain supporting records for all financial transactions. Such expenditure not only compromises the reliability of financial statements but also exposes the donor funded projects to the risks of misappropriation of funds.

## 4.2.5 Accounting for Cash and Cash Equivalents

The statements of financial assets and liabilities for the two hundred and thirteen (213) donor funded projects reflected cash and cash equivalents balance amounting to Kshs.37,126,490,434 as at 30 June, 2024.

Review of the financial statements revealed weaknesses in the reporting and management of cash amounting to Kshs.4,913,786,055 in fourteen (14) donor funded projects as detailed in **Appendix 8**. Issues identified include unsupported or unexplained balances, lack of bank reconciliation statements, and failure to maintain dedicated project bank accounts in accordance with Regulation 76(1) of the Public Finance Management (National Government) Regulations, 2015.

#### 4.2.6 Unresolved Prior Year Matters

In the audit reports of the previous year, one hundred and fifty-one (151) donor funded projects as detailed in **Appendix 9** had several issues raised under Report on the Financial Statements, Report on Lawfulness and Effectiveness in Use of Public Resources and Report on Effectiveness of Internal Controls, Risk Management and Governance. However, Management had not resolved the issues or given any explanation for failure to resolve them.

## 4.3 Project Management Issues




Figure 9: Issues Related to Project Management in Donor Funded Projects

The audit of donor funded projects for the year revealed persistent implementation challenges that continue to affect the efficiency and effectiveness of development interventions across various sectors. Although the projects attracted substantial financial support from both development partners and the Government of Kenya, a number of systemic and operational weaknesses were identified. These included delays in fund disbursement, inadequate counterpart funding, stalled and incomplete projects, and instances of ineligible expenditure as illustrated in **Figure 9** below.

The findings point to gaps in project planning, financial management, and oversight, which pose significant risks to the achievement of intended outcomes and the sustainability of donor supported initiatives.

## 4.3.1 Project Funding

During the year under review, a total of two hundred and thirteen (213) donor funded projects were audited. The projects had a combined financial commitment totalling Kshs.2,285,405,649,004. This included a total of Kshs.551,033,824,920 being Government Counterpart Funding, and the balance funded through donor loans and grants. Details of these amounts are tabulated **Appendix 10**.

#### 4.3.2 Issues Relating to Counterpart Funding

Review of project implementation across the donor funded projects revealed that twenty (20) donor funded projects faced challenges relating to Government counterpart funding. Some projects recorded counterpart underfunding while others channeled funds through undesignated project accounts, and lacked supporting documentation for counterpart disbursements as detailed in **Appendix 11**.

These lapses contravened the provisions of financing agreements and public finance management regulations, thereby affecting the timely execution of activities and increasing the risk of delayed or compromised achievement of project outcomes.

#### 4.3.3 Delayed Disbursement of Project Funds

During the year under review, the audit revealed that seven (7) donor funded projects, as detailed in **Table 9** below, experienced delays in the disbursement of project funds, totalling Kshs.2,067,314,443. The delays were attributed to late issuance of exchequer releases, partial disbursements by development partners,

retention of funds by the Central Bank of Kenya, and failure by implementing entities to transfer funds to designated project accounts on time.

Further, in the Case Study on Integrated Delivery of Selected Non-Communicable Diseases in Kenya (PHGF) implemented by Moi Teaching and Referral Hospital, project funds remained undisbursed despite the project having closed on 31 January, 2022.

In addition, Multi-national Program to Build Resilience for Food and Nutrition Security in the Horn of Africa (BREFONS) implemented by the State Department for Agriculture and Financing Locally-Led Climate Action Program Project implemented by The National Treasury experienced prolonged delays of four (4) months and one (1) year respectively.

## 4.3.4 Failure to Close Projects and Idle Funds/Bank Balances

Review of project implementation revealed that thirty (30) donor funded projects, whose project duration had ended as at 30 June, 2024 but had not been officially closed as detailed in **Appendix 12**. In most cases, project closure reports had not been prepared, assets had not been formally handed over, and no justification was provided for the delay.

Notably, three (3) inactive projects continued to hold substantial balances totalling Kshs.135,832,586 in their bank accounts. The details are as indicated in **Table 10** below,

Failure to close projects in a timely manner undermines accountability and risks mismanagement of public resources, in addition to contravening the provisions of the financing agreements on financial closure and reporting.

#### 4.3.5 Delayed Projects

Review of the project implementation status reports for the two hundred and thirteen (213) donor funded projects revealed a delay in project implementation across fifty (50) donor funded projects as detailed in **Appendix 13**. Although the contractual

completion dates for the projects had not lapsed as at 30 June, 2024, the pace of implementation was significantly behind planned schedules. Delays were attributed to various factors, including protracted procurement processes, delays in land acquisition and compensation, inadequate budgetary allocations, slow disbursement of funds, and underperformance by contractors.

Further, nine (9) of the fifty (50) delayed projects were being implemented by the Kenya National Highways Authority (KeNHA). For instance, the Horn of Africa Gateway Development Project (Credit No. 6768-KE) had drawn Kshs.11,957,602,955 or 15% of the total funding compared to 50% project period which had lapsed, an indication that the project was behind schedule.

Similarly, the Kenya–South Sudan Link Road Project had received only Kshs.1,705,348,406 out of a total Kshs.16,006,231,974 as at 30 June, 2024, reflecting an absorption of just 11%. The balance of Kshs.14,300,883,568 (89%) remained undrawn, raising concerns over the possibility of utilizing the funds within the remaining implementation period.

Delays of this nature undermine the timely delivery of intended project benefits and may expose the Government to avoidable financial penalties and reduced development impact.

## 4.3.6 Stalled Projects

During the year under review, nine (9) donor funded projects as summarized in **Table 11** below were found to have stalled, raising concerns on inefficient utilization of resources, delayed delivery of intended benefits, and the risk of failing to achieve project objectives.

The East Africa Skills for Transformation and Regional Integration Project implemented by Meru National Polytechnic, construction works valued at Kshs.444,473,290 stalled due to unresolved contractual disputes that remain in court. Similarly, The Establishment of Bus Rapid Transit Line 5 Project had not commenced more than two years after its scheduled start date, with idle funds amounting to Kshs.320,579,360. These instances undermine value for money and hinder the timely delivery of essential services and infrastructure to intended beneficiaries.

#### 4.3.7 Incomplete Projects

Review of the projects implementation status reports revealed that twenty-eight (28) donor funded projects had not been completed within their contractual timelines, despite significant funding towards the projects as detailed in **Appendix 14**. Notable delays included the Dualling of Magongo Road, whose level of completion stood at 92% complete despite a twenty-four (24) month extension, and the Kapchorwa—Suam—Kitale Road, which remained incomplete even after 263% of the contract period had lapsed. In the health sector, the East Africa Kidney Institute remained incomplete four (4) years after the expected completion date, despite the Government having already commenced loan repayments, with the intended benefits yet to be realized. Other incomplete projects include boreholes, idle agricultural infrastructure, and incomplete sanitation and water systems.

Notably, the State Department for Agriculture was the most affected implementing agency, with projects worth Kshs.2,748,759,416 either incomplete, underutilized, or abandoned. Key findings included: unproductive boreholes in arid counties, non-operational livestock and irrigation facilities, idle agro-processing units, and failure to commission completed works due to unresolved land ownership and planning deficiencies.

These delays and contract overruns raise concerns over project oversight, value for money, and the Government's ability to achieve intended development outcomes.

## 4.3.8 Interest on Delayed Payments

During the year under review, the audit revealed that avoidable interest payments amounting to Kshs.4,882,803,834 were incurred across seventeen (17) donor funded projects as detailed in **Appendix 15** due to delayed settlement of certified works and contractor's invoices. A significant portion of the interest, totalling Kshs.930,599,071, originated from the COVID-19 Health Emergency Response Project. The amount relates to interest accrued on payments made by the African Vaccine Acquisition Trust (AVAT) to the vaccine manufacturer for 13,333,333 doses that had been made available for delivery under the contractual agreement. Other projects with high interest charges included the Mombasa-Mariakani Highway Project, which incurred a total of Kshs.856,733,470 and the Sirari Corridor Accessibility and Road Safety Improvement Project, which paid Kshs.657,026,738 in interest. These instances reflect weak contract oversight which undermines value for money and effective donor fund utilization.

#### 4.3.9 Ineligible Expenditure

During the year under review, the audit revealed ineligible expenditures amounting to Kshs.1,808,822,598 across fifteen (15) donor funded projects as detailed in **Appendix 16**. These costs were incurred contrary to the terms of financing agreements, the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, and related guidelines. Key findings here included: unauthorized over-expenditures, irregular salary enhancements, use of project funds for unapproved and unrelated activities, and premature commitments of funds.

For instance, the Africa Climate Summit Project spent Kshs.475,515,000 during the summit that took place in September 2023, yet the financing agreement was signed on 15 November 2023, over two (2) months after the summit had already taken place, rendering the expenditure ineligible. Similarly, the Transforming Health Systems for Universal Care Project incurred Kshs.314,923,413 in expenditure despite a nil final budget, contravening Section 68(2)(h) of the Public Finance and Management Act, 2012, which requires all expenditures to be aligned with approved estimates.

Other significant ineligible expenditures include Kenya Water Security and Climate Resilience Project which incurred an amount of Kshs.301,801,257 due to idle time and prematurely connected utilities before land acquisition was finalized. An additional an amount of Kshs.178,638,946 was reported as unauthorized over-expenditure under the Support to Technical and Vocational Education Training and Entrepreneurship Project, representing a 23% excess above the approved budget without requisite approvals.

These findings reflect systemic weaknesses in financial controls, budgeting, and compliance with funding conditions across implementing entities.

### 4.3.10 Low Absorption of Funds

Review of the donor funded projects revealed that forty-four (44) donor funded projects as detailed in **Appendix 17** had low absorption of funds, undermining the achievement of intended objectives within the stipulated project timelines. These projects had consumed a significant portion of their planned implementation period but had drawn down minimal portions of the committed funds.

The Mombasa Gate Bridge Construction Project had utilized an amount of Kshs.960,459,051, representing 2% of the total commitment of Kshs.49,069,870,935, despite four years of project duration that ended on 25 April, 2025. Similarly, the Kenya Off-Grid Solar Access Project, implemented by the Rural Electrification and Renewable Energy Corporation, had utilized only Kshs.32,740,775, or 1% of the committed amount of Kshs.3,500,000,000.

Other projects, such as the Kenya Off-Grid Solar Access Project (KOSAP-SNV), showed a utilization of only Kshs.294,689,196 out of an approved commitment of Kshs.4,700,000,000, equivalent to an absorption rate of 6%, the project period had already elapsed as at 30 June, 2024.

The continued underutilization of committed resources raises concerns over project delivery capability, and may lead to project extensions, cost overruns, and the risk of penalties or donor disengagement.

## 4.4 Contingent Liabilities

The audit identified contingent liabilities totalling to Kshs.744,188,950 in four (4) donor funded projects, representing potential financial obligations that could materialize from pending legal cases. The Kenya Rural Roads Authority faces the largest exposure at Kshs.642,516,239 due to a High Court appeal, while least liabilities were reported by the Ministry of Health with a total of Kshs.4,432,141 as detailed in **Table 12**.

These contingent liabilities create significant budgetary risks and highlight the need for proactive legal resolution and proper exit strategies for donor funded projects.

## 4.5 Compliance Issues

As required by Article 229(6) of the Constitution of Kenya, audit procedures were carried out to determine whether donor funded projects were lawfully and effectively implemented and whether public resources, including counterpart funds, were applied in accordance with the law. The audit observations on compliance matters revealed a general lack of adherence to the laws and regulations governing the management of public resources.




Figure 10: Compliance Issues in Donor Funded Projects

A summary of the compliance issues observed, and the number of Donor funded projects affected in illustrated in **Figure 10** below;

## 4.5.1 Failure to Maintain Separate Bank Accounts for the Projects

A total of seventeen (17) donor funded projects were found to have commingled project funds as detailed in **Appendix 18**. This was contrary to Regulation 76(1) of the Public Finance Management (National Government) Regulations, 2015, which requires separate bank accounts to be maintained for each project at the Central Bank of Kenya.

This issue was particularly pronounced in Kenya Electricity Transmission Company Limited's projects which accounted for four (4) of the seventeen (17) cases lacking distinct accounts, resulting in material variances between bank statements and cashbook balances. In some instances, funds were entirely managed through operational accounts of implementing agencies, undermining financial accountability, transparency, and proper tracking of both donor and public resources.

## 4.5.2 Non-Compliance with Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015

During the year under review, the audit revealed non-compliance with the provisions of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act (PPADA), 2015 resulted in procurement irregularities amounting to Kshs.3,737,379,730 in twenty-one (21) donor funded projects as detailed in **Appendix 19**. Some of the issues highlighted include:

- i. Inadequate Specification of Procurement Requirements: In some instances, the procuring entities failed to provide bidders with comprehensive and clear procurement specifications, contrary to Section 60(1) of the Act. This led to challenges in implementation and eventual contract variations. For example, under the Kenya Electricity Expansion Project, bidders were not furnished with all the specific requirements relating to goods, works, and services, resulting in variations amounting to Kshs.38,181,354.
- ii. Non-Adherence to Approved Procurement Plans: Several projects failed to implement activities as per their approved procurement plans, resulting in delays and underutilization of budgeted resources. For example, the Horn of Africa Gateway Development Project implemented by the National Transport and Safety Authority, where failure to follow the procurement plan led to unimplemented activities valued at Kshs.1,056,487,955.
- iii. Irregular Contract Variations: The audit revealed instances where contract variations were effected contrary to Section 139(3) of the Act, which only permits variations after 12 months from contract signing. For example, the Regional Flagship Marine and Transport and Ports Logistics Centre Project implemented by Kenya Coast National Polytechnic had its contract varied by Kshs.5,317,828 within eight months of award. Similarly, the East Africa's Centre of Excellence for Skills and Tertiary Education recorded variations amounting to Kshs.298,396,698, a portion of which occurred within one year and lacked review by the contract implementation team.

- iv. Use of Direct Procurement Without Proper Disclosure: Some entities engaged in direct procurement without adhering to disclosure requirements under Regulation 90(1)(b) of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Regulations, 2020. For instance, the Horn of Africa Gateway Development Project under the ICT Authority single-sourced two training consultants at a cost of Kshs.9,798,562 but did not report the procurement to the Public Procurement Regulatory Authority.
- v. **Breach of Low-Value Procurement Thresholds**: The audit noted instances where the procurement of goods and services using cash-based methods exceeded the allowable limit of Kshs.50,000 as stipulated in Section 45(3)(b) of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Regulations, 2020. For instance, in the Rural Kenya Financial Inclusion Facility (RK FINFA) project, direct procurement through standing imprest amounted to Kshs.7,347,957, far exceeding the permissible cash threshold.
- vi. Payments made without Adherence to Contractual or Regulatory Conditions: There were cases where payments were made contrary to contract terms or in the absence of supporting documentation. Under the Rural Electrification in Five Regions Project, the contractor received Kshs.113,822,110, or 83% of the contract sum, despite implementation progress standing at only 42%, breaching Regulation 150(1) of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Regulations, 2020. In the case of Financing Locally-Led Climate Action Program Project, The National Treasury made an advance payment of Kshs.6,260,746 for training without providing tender documents or contract evidence, contrary to Section 146 of the Act.
- vii. Failure to Charge Liquidated Damages: Contractual obligations under the Coastal Region Water Security Project (Kwale Town Urban Water Supply) were not fully upheld due to the failure by the implementing agency to recover applicable liquidated damages from the contractor. Awarded at a contract sum of Kshs.426,338,937 with an original completion date of June, 2021, the project stalled at 67% progress by March, 2023 despite three extensions. While COVID-19 contributed to delays, the State Department for Irrigation contract without enforcing the Clause 45.1 agreement mandating liquidated damages recovery for non-performance. This omission represents a direct financial loss and undermines accountability mechanisms for contractor default. This is contrary to Section 140 of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015.

These weaknesses noted undermined transparency, value for money, and accountability in the procurement process.

### 4.5.3 Contract Variation Exceeding 25%

The audit revealed that seven (7) donor funded projects as detailed in **Table 13** had unauthorized contract variations amounting to Kshs.11,029,230,604, which exceeded the 25% threshold allowed under Section 139 of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015.

For instance, the Dualling of Magongo Road (Phase II) project experienced a 99.8% variation in consultancy services from the original contract sum of Kshs.97,326,900 to Kshs.194,429,055. Similarly, under the Water and Sanitation Development Project consultancy fees were revised upwards by 131%, from the initial Kshs.76,959,355 to Kshs.177,739,431. In the Thwake Multipurpose Water Development Program, the construction cost of the dam increased by 32%, amounting to Kshs.10,331,132,256.

Other non-compliances included variations which were implemented without the necessary technical or contract implementation committee reviews, while other variations were based on expired agreements, or were supported by addenda signed after the expiry of the initial contract period, thereby undermining the legality of such extensions.

### 4.5.4 Non-Compliance with Financing Agreement

Review of the donor funded projects revealed that thirty-two (32) donor funded projects as detailed in **Appendix 20** were found to have breached the terms and conditions set out in their respective financing agreements. Some of the areas of non-compliance noted include:

- i. Failure to Refund Unspent Balances to Donors: Some implementing entities did not remit unutilized project funds back to the donors after the expiry or completion of the project, contrary to the refund clauses in the grant or credit agreements. For instance, the Ministry of Environment, Climate Change and Forestry had a fund balance of Kshs.109,379,931 under the Africa Climate Summit and Africa Climate Week, which was not reimbursed to the donor as required under Clause 5.3 of the grant agreement.
- ii. Holding Project Funds in Unapproved Bank Accounts: Funds were in some cases maintained in commercial bank accounts that were not specified or approved under the financing agreements, undermining donor oversight and financial controls. For example, the Integrated Programme to Build Resilience to Climate Change, implemented by the National Environment

- Management Authority (NEMA), held a balance of Kshs.3,693,419 in a commercial bank that differed from the account stipulated in the financing agreement.
- iii. Delayed Fund Utilization Resulting in Commitment Charges: In some instances, delays in drawing down committed funds exposed the Government to unnecessary commitment fees charged on undisbursed balances. For instance, The Kenya Off-Grid Solar Access Project for Underserved Counties, implemented by the Rural Electrification and Renewable Energy Corporation, attracted Kshs.16,945,655 in commitment fees as at 30 June, 2024 due to undrawn balances, charged at 0.5% of the undisbursed amount.
- iv. Execution of Unapproved Activities without Donor Consent: Implementing entities sometimes undertook project activities not included in the approved annual work plans, or reallocated funds without obtaining the donor's "No Objection". For example, the Global Fund HIV/AIDS Project (KEN-H-TNT-2065), implemented by the National Syndemic Diseases Control Council reprogrammed Kshs.324,907,572 for the procurement of health commodities without documented donor approval.
- v. Incomplete or Unusable Project Outputs Due to Poor Planning: Failure to share project plans with key stakeholders and poor supervision resulted in facilities that were incomplete or unusable for their intended purpose. The Kenya Development Response to Displacement Impacts Project (KDRDIP) implemented by the Ministry of East African Community (EAC), ASALs and Regional Development, spent Kshs.12,500,000 constructing hospital wards at Kakuma Sub-County Hospital that were found to lack washrooms, rendering them unusable.
- vi. Lack of Oversight and Governance Structures: Several projects did not convene the required steering committee meetings or submit progress reports as stipulated in the financing agreements. For instance, Thwake Multipurpose Water Development Program, implemented by the State Department for Water and Sanitation, did not hold any National Program Steering Committee meetings during year under review, contrary to the governance structure outlined in the financing agreement.
- vii. Non-Remittance of Counterpart Funding by Government Entities: Some County Governments and Agencies failed to contribute their agreed counterpart funding, as stipulated in co-financing arrangements. For instance, under the DANIDA Primary Healthcare Support Program, twelve (12) counties failed to contribute Kshs.102,671,124 in counterpart funding, thereby breaching their financial obligations.

- viii. Failure to Adhere to Donor Branding and Visibility Requirements:

  Communication and visibility plans required under the financing agreements were in some cases not developed or implemented. The Office of the Attorney General and Department of Justice, implementing the Programme for Legal Empowerment and AID Delivery, had no visibility plan in place even as the project approached closure, contrary to the agreement.
- ix. Over-Financing and Receipt of Funds after Project Closure: There were cases where projects either received disbursements beyond the agreed end date or obtained financing in excess of the approved agreement limits. For instance. Agricultural Sector Development Support Programme implemented bv the State Department for Agriculture Kshs.12,523,470 after the closure date, while the Western Kenya Road Improvement Project implemented by Kenya Rural Roads Authority received Kshs.1,467,856,772 against an agreement total of Kshs.1,370,000,000 under the, resulting in unexplained overfinancing of Kshs.97,856,772.

These breaches undermine donor trust, and compromise on project sustainability.

### 4.5.5 Non-Compliance with Public Finance Management Act, 2012

The audit revealed material compliance breaches in twenty-six (26) donor funded projects, as categorized below:

- i. Improper Use or Retention of Funds: The audit revealed that three (3) donor funded projects were flagged for the improper use or retention of funds, contrary to various provisions of the Public Finance Management Regulations as detailed below:
  - a) Kenya Electricity Expansion Project under the Rural Electrification and Renewable Energy Corporation paid an amount of Kshs.79,142,646 from the Corporation's general bank account instead of the designated project account, contrary to Regulation 4(c) of the Public Finance Management (National Government) Regulations, 2015, which requires funds for donor financed projects to be managed separately.
  - b) The Kenya Electricity Modernization Project, implemented by the State Department for Energy, retained Kshs.75,777,583 in the project account after project closure, in violation of Regulation 74(6)(d), which mandates the return of unspent balances to the National Exchequer upon project completion.
  - c) Olkaria-Lessos-Kisumu Transmission Lines Project by Kenya Electricity Transmission Company Limited (KETRACO) recorded a transfer of Kshs.4,661,039 from KETRACO that was not part of the approved budget and remained unrefunded, contravening Section 43(1)(a) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, which restricts expenditures to only those approved in the budget.

- ii. **Unapproved/Unsupported or Unauthorized Expenditure:** Three (3) projects incurred an expenditure amounting to Kshs.11,490,073,794 without adhering to approved procurement plans or without securing formal budget approvals.
  - a) The Eastern and Southern Africa Higher Education Centres of Excellence (ACE II) Project, implemented by the State Department for Higher Education and Research, spent Kshs.2,115,920 on MacBook laptops and iPads, yet the expenditure was not supported by an approved and updated procurement plan.
  - b) The Kenya Primary Education Equity in Learning Project reported a budget of Kshs.11,813,990,890 and related expenditure of Kshs.11,487,957,874, despite lacking any formal approval for the stated budget. These are contrary to Regulation 51(2) of the Public Finance Management (National Government) Regulations, 2015, which requires that spending be controlled based on allocations and allotments from the approved budgets.
  - c) Transforming Health Systems for Universal Care (THS-UC) Project under the State Department for Medical Services incurred Kshs.314,923,413 in expenditure despite having nil receipts and expenditure budgets, pointing to unauthorized spending, contrary to Section 44(1)(a) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 and Regulation 51(2) of the Public Finance Management (National Government) Regulations, 2015.
- iii. **Imprest Management:** Five (5) donor funded projects recorded irregularities in the issuance and management of imprests, undermining accountability and breaching the Public Finance Management (National Government) Regulations, 2015.
  - a) The Horn of Africa Gateway Project implemented by the Kenya Revenue Authority, issued additional imprests to officers before the surrender of previous ones, contrary to Regulation 93(4)(b).
  - b) The Africa Center of Excellence in Sustainable Use of Insects as Food and Feeds at Jaramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and Technology had outstanding imprests totalling Kshs.2,071,912 that remained unsurrendered at the end of the financial year, in contravention with the provisions under Regulation 93(3) which require that an imprest shall be surrendered within seven days after the completion of the activity for which it was issued.
  - c) Four (4) projects as detailed in **Table 14** below had issued group imprest amounting to Kshs.99,752,086. This is contravention to Regulation 93(1)(a), which provides that an Accounting Officer may issue an imprest to a public officer for the purpose of carrying out a specific assignment only if the public officer is responsible for carrying out the assignment.

- d) Public Debt Management Support Project by The National Treasury included Kshs.6,278,228 in project expenditure for foreign travel, yet the related claims were submitted after travel completion, in contravention of Regulation 93(3) of the Public Finance Management Regulations, which requires that imprests be surrendered within seven days after the completion of the activity.
- iv. Asset Management: Five (5) donor funded projects exhibited weaknesses in the management and reporting of assets, specifically in maintaining fixed assets registers and timely handover of project assets, in breach of Regulation 136(1) of the Public Finance Management (National Government) Regulations, 2015 which requires Accounting Officers to maintain a complete and regularly updated record of all assets under their control.
  - a) Projects such as the Kenya Social and Economic Inclusion Project, the East Africa Skills Transformation and Regional Integration Project, and the Sirari Corridor Accessibility and Road Safety Improvement Project did not have proper asset registers in place.
  - b) Both the Kenya Youth Employment and Opportunities Project under the State Department for Youth Affairs and Creative Economy, and the Kenya Youth Employment Opportunities Project under the State Department for Labour and Skills Development, failed to hand over

project assets upon closure. The latter experienced a seven-month delay, contrary to Regulation 74(6)(b) of the Public Finance Management (National Government) Regulations, 2015 which states that the accounting officer shall ensure that where a project is completed or where no time frame is provided for the project, the project assets, including inventories, are properly recorded and handed over to the relevant public entity and, where no time frame is provided for the project, ensure that the assets are handed over within three months from the date of the closure of the project.

- c) The Strengthening Drought Resilience for Small Holder Farmers and Pastoralists in the IGAD Region Project, the Kenya Water Security and Climate Resilience Project, and the Transforming Health Systems for Universal Care Project lacked complete or updated asset registers.
- d) The Eastern and Southern Africa Higher Education Centres of Excellence (ACE II) Project had an incomplete asset register while the Global Fund Universal HIV Program under the State Department for Medical Services did not maintain a fixed asset register despite owning significant project assets.
- v. **Non-remittance of Statutory Deductions:** Several implementing agencies failed to remit statutory deductions such as Value Added Tax (VAT) and withholding tax, to Kenya Revenue Authority, exposing the donor funded projects to penalties.
  - a) Northern Collector Phase 1 Project implemented by Athi Water Works Development Agency failed to remit Kshs.516,658,649 in Value Added Tax (VAT) to Kenya Revenue Authority.
  - b) Kenya Electricity Modernisation Project under the State Department for Energy failed to remit Kshs.11,103,358 in withholding tax on payments to various consultants.
  - c) The Nairobi Water and Sanitation Project, implemented by Athi Water Works Development Agency, failed to remit Kshs.140,158,079 in VAT.
  - d) Thwake Multi-purpose Water Development Program Phase 1 under the State Department for Water and Sanitation had unremitted VAT of Kshs.203,979,306.
  - e) Kenya Social and Economic Inclusion Project under the State Department for Social Protection and Senior Citizen Affairs failed to deduct and remit mandatory statutory deductions totalling Kshs.4,998,454. Specifically, Kshs.3,035,542 was not remitted to the National Social Security Fund (NSSF), Kshs.930,500 to the National Hospital Insurance Fund (NHIF), and Kshs.1,032,412 to the Housing Levy Fund.

This is contrary to Section 23(2)(a) of the Public Finance Management (National Government) Regulations, 2015, which requires that Accounting Officers ensure timely and full compliance with all tax obligations, levies, duties, pension commitments, and audit requirements as provided for in relevant legislation.

- vi. **Unauthorized Borrowing and Overdrafts:** The audit identified two (2) donor funded projects that had unauthorized overdrafts and internal borrowing without prior approval from The National Treasury.
  - a) 220KV and 132KV Transmission Lines and Sub-Stations (EXIM Bank of India Funded) implemented by The Kenya Electricity Transmission Company Limited reported a cash book overdraft of Kshs.71,216,521 without the required authority to overdraw the account, contrary to Section 28(4) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012.
  - b) The State Department for Water and Sanitation borrowed Kshs.1,043,000 from the Water and Sanitation Development Project account to facilitate a reconnaissance visit in Narok County. The activity was initially budgeted under the GoK local travel vote but was irregularly financed through the conditional liquidity support grant. The transfer lacked approval from The National Treasury, contravening Section 48(1) and (2) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, and no evidence was provided to confirm whether the amount was reimbursed.
- vii. **Delayed or Non-Submission of Financial Statements:** Three (3) donor funded projects failed to comply with statutory timelines for the preparation and submission of annual financial statements, contrary to Section 44(1)(a) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, which requires accounting officers to submit financial statements to The National Treasury and the Auditor-General within three months after the end of the financial year.
  - a) Under the Financing Locally-Led Climate Action Program, twenty-one (21) County Governments failed to submit financial statements. The total funding to the said County Governments amounted to Kshs.3,007,330,722.
  - b) Kenya Health Sector Programme Support III (DANIDA Grant) implemented by the County Government of Kisii and the Horn of Africa Groundwater for Resilience Project implemented Water Sector Trust Fund, both delayed the submission of financial statements.

### 4.5.6 Non-Compliance with Employment Act, 2007

During the year under review, four (4) donor funded projects were found to have violated the provisions of the Employment Act, 2007 relating to recruitment processes, minimum wage requirements, and engagement of casual workers. These breaches include:

i. Kenya Health Sector Programme Support III under the County Government of Kisii engaged casual workers in health facilities and paid wages ranging between Kshs.3,000 and Kshs.6,000 per month, which was significantly below the statutory minimum wage of Kshs.9,673, as set out in Legal Notice No.125 - Regulation of Wages Order. Further, the recruitment process and justification for the Kshs.21,151,536 cash payments made to these workers were not provided for audit.

- ii. Africa Center of Excellence in Sustainable Use of Insects as Food and Feeds Project at Jaramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and Technology engaged five casual workers continuously for 12 months, contrary to Section 37(1)(b) of the Employment Act, which requires that such employment be converted into a monthly contract where work exceeds the equivalent of three months.
- iii. Kenya Social and Economic Inclusion Project, implemented by the State Department for Social Protection, irregularly recruited one hundred and ninety-three (193) casuals, one hundred and sixty-one (161) mentors and supervisors without providing supporting documentation which included advertisement, shortlisting, or interview processes, contravening the principles of fair and competitive recruitment under Section 5(2) of the Employment Act, 2007.
- iv. Kenya Rural Transformation Centers Digital Platform Project at the Cooperative University of Kenya directly appointed a Project Manager at a consolidated monthly salary of Kshs.110,000, without a competitive process, also violating Section 5(2) of the Employment Act, 2007.

### 4.5.7 Non-Compliance with Other Legal and Regulatory Frameworks

During the year under review, four (4) donor funded projects had various noncompliances with applicable sectoral legislations, contractual terms, and grant conditions, undermining transparency, inclusivity, and accountability in project execution.

- i. The USAID Boresha Jamii Project at Jaramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and Technology had fifteen (15) out of twenty-six (26) staff from the same ethnic community, contravening Section 7(1) and (2) of the National Cohesion and Integration Act, 2008, which requires public institutions to reflect Kenya's ethnic diversity.
- ii. The Northern Collector Phase 1 Project under Athi Water Works Development Agency faced challenges with land compensation, where thirteen (13) landowners had not been fully compensated and twenty-five (25) others awaited payment for wayleaves. These delays were contrary to Section 111 of the Land Act, 2012, which requires prompt and full compensation for compulsory acquisition of land.
- iii. The Resilient Sustainable Systems for Health (RSSH) Project, implemented by the State Department for Public Health, failed to put in place a Sub-Recipient Agreement as required under the Global Fund Grant Regulations, 2014, for funds risking breach of donor conditions.

iv. Rwabura Irrigation Development Project by the National Irrigation Authority, disbursements were made without clear drawdown terms or deliverables, raising concerns over financial prudence and agreement compliance.

### 4.6 Internal Controls, Risk Management and Governance

As required by Section 7(1)(a) of the Public Audit Act, 2015, the Office conducted and performed audit procedures to confirm whether the internal controls, risk management and overall governance structures were effective.

### 4.6.1 Internal Controls and Risk Management

### 4.6.1.1 Lack of Risk Management Policy

Review of the donor funded projects revealed that several donor funded projects operated without risk management policies, disaster recovery plans, or business continuity plans.

#### 4.6.2 Weaknesses in Internal Controls and Governance

The audit review of donor funded projects identified other internal control and governance issues as listed below:

- i. Lack of an effective Audit Committee and Internal Audit Units.
- ii. Failure to maintain a separate imprest register.
- iii. Inadequate staffing.
- iv. Non-operational Project Steering Committee
- v. Lack of supervision and monitoring of beneficiaries
- vi. Delays in installation and exposure of equipment.
- vii. Lack of land ownership documentation.
- viii. Manual preparation of financial statements.
- ix. Lack of approved scheme of service.

These weaknesses hinder the projects' capacity to monitor internal controls, identify irregularities, and uphold compliance with established policies and procedures. A robust internal audit function is essential, as it offers independent assurance on the effectiveness of risk management, internal control systems, and governance structures ensuring accountability and transparency in the use of resources.

# 5.0 ROOT CAUSE ANALYSIS, RECOMMENDATIONS, AND STRATEGY FOR ZERO-FAULT AUDIT

Review of donor funded projects for the financial year ended 30 June, 2024 revealed a complex landscape of progress, persistent challenges, and systemic weaknesses. While a majority of the 213 audited projects received unmodified opinions, a significant number of 43 projects were issued qualified opinions, and one project received an adverse opinion. These findings underscore the need for a deeper examination of the underlying causes and a strategic roadmap toward achieving flawless audit outcomes.

### 5.1 Root Cause Analysis

The audit of donor funded projects uncovered several recurring and systemic issues that significantly hinder both effective implementation and sound financial management. A key challenge lies in weak governance and oversight, where many implementing agencies operate without functional audit committees or adequately resourced internal audit units. Additionally, risk management systems are often absent or poorly enforced, leaving projects exposed to financial and operational risks.

The audit also revealed inadequate financial management systems across numerous projects. Common issues include inaccurate or incomplete financial statements, failure to reconcile accounts, and expenditures made without proper documentation. In several instances, project funds were not tracked separately, resulting in the commingling of resources and a lack of financial transparency.

Non-compliance with legal and donor requirements was another major concern. Violations of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, procurement regulations, and donor agreements were widespread, encompassing unauthorized spending, contract variations exceeding legal limits, and non-remittance of statutory deductions.

The report further highlighted project implementation inefficiencies, with delays in fund disbursement, procurement hurdles, and underperformance by contractors leading to unfinished or stalled initiatives. Some projects remained active long after their planned completion dates, while allocated funds remained idle in project accounts.

Lastly, the audit identified a lack of accountability and weak consequence management. Despite repeated findings of non-compliance, sanctions were rarely applied. This has encouraged a culture of impunity, where audit recommendations are often disregarded and financial discipline remains weak.

Overall, these systemic weaknesses point to the urgent need for structural reforms to improve governance, enhance financial systems, ensure compliance, and enforce accountability in the management of donor-funded projects

### 5.2 Recommendations

To effectively address the challenges identified in the audit of donor-funded projects, a set of targeted recommendations has been proposed, focusing on strengthening governance, enhancing financial management, improving legal compliance, and optimizing project implementation.

In terms of governance and oversight, it is recommended that all implementing agencies establish and operationalize audit committees. Internal audit functions should be adequately staffed, resourced, and operate with full independence. Additionally, agencies should develop and implement robust risk management policies and disaster recovery plans to safeguard project integrity.

For financial management, automation of financial reporting systems is advised to minimize manual errors and enhance accuracy. Clear and enforceable documentation standards should be instituted for all financial transactions. Each donor-funded project should maintain a separate bank account to prevent fund commingling, and regular bank reconciliations and timely financial reporting must be enforced.

Under compliance and legal adherence, there is a need to train project staff on procurement laws, donor financing agreements, and relevant financial regulations. Internal compliance audits should be routinely conducted, and any identified breaches must result in corrective action. Persistent unresolved audit issues should attract sanctions in accordance with Section 204(1)(g) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012.

To strengthen project implementation, all initiatives should be preceded by thorough feasibility studies and stakeholder engagement. Procurement planning should be improved, and contractors must be vetted rigorously. Clear protocols for project closure, including proper asset handover and financial reconciliation, should be developed. Lastly, disbursements should be aligned with actual project milestones to ensure funds are used effectively and in a timely manner.

Collectively, these recommendations aim to enhance the transparency, accountability, and effectiveness of donor-funded project management.

## **5.3** Strategy Towards a Zero-Fault Audit

Achieving a zero-fault audit requires a deliberate, multifaceted strategy centered on strengthening institutions, enhancing policies, enforcing accountability, engaging stakeholders, and fostering a culture of continuous improvement.

The first pillar, Institutional Strengthening, emphasizes the need to invest in building technical capacities in key areas such as internal audit, finance, procurement, and project management. Digitization of financial and procurement systems is also crucial to enhance transparency, efficiency, and traceability.

Under Policy and Framework Enhancement, the strategy calls for the development and strict enforcement of Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) specific to donor-funded projects. Moreover, internal policies should be aligned with the best global practices, particularly the International Public Sector Accounting Standards (IPSAS) and the International Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAIs).

Accountability and Enforcement is another core pillar, which includes introducing performance-based contracts for project managers and accounting officers. A centralized system should be established to track the implementation of audit recommendations, and disciplinary actions must be enforced for persistent non-compliance and audit failures.

Stakeholder Engagement is also essential. This involves fostering collaboration among development partners, oversight bodies, and civil society. Transparency should be promoted through regular public disclosure of audit findings and project performance updates.

Lastly, Continuous Improvement should be institutionalized through routine pre-audit readiness assessments, post-audit reviews, and regular training sessions. Sharing knowledge on audit best practices and encouraging innovation in project design and evaluation will ensure sustained progress toward audit excellence.

Together, these strategic pillars provide a roadmap toward achieving a transparent, accountable, and efficient audit environment in donor-funded projects.

### 5.4 Conclusion

Audit of donor funded projects for the year under review paints a mixed picture, one of progress in some areas and persistent weaknesses in others. Addressing the root causes of audit issues requires a coordinated effort across all levels of government and implementing agencies. With strong leadership, robust systems, and a culture of accountability, Kenya can move decisively toward a future where donor funds are managed with integrity, efficiency, and transparency and ultimately achieving the goal of a zero-fault audit environment.
